Subject: Trash and Recycling

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF ALL RESIDENTS TO DISPOSE OF TRASH AND UNWANTED ITEMS AS DESCRIBED BELOW.

Kitchen Garbage – is to be in garbage bags and placed in the large trash containers. The large trash containers are for **Kitchen Garage ONLY! NO furniture**, **No construction material**. Furniture and construction items are to be disposed as stated below.

Recyclable - items are to be placed in the small green containers WITH YELLOW TOP. Only recyclable items can be placed in the recycle containers. We must follow the Collier County Recycling Policies as explained below.

Waste Management will not take anything that is not in the recycle container and is not a recyclable item. This requires the flattening of cardboard and breaking it down to no larger than 3' X 3' so that it fits in the recycle container with top closed. You can take large items to one of the several Collier County recycle centers.

Follow this guide as to what may/may not be placed in the recycle bins.

Styrofoam of any form
Clothing

Disposal Options for Furniture, Construction or non recyclable items

- 1. You can take take items to a Collier County Landfill. The closest landfill is 4.9 miles away on 3730 White Lake Blvd.
- 2. You can hire a company such as 1-800-GOT-JUNK? or College Hunks Hauling Junk.
- 3. Items in good condition may be picked up by a charitable organization such as St. Matthew's House or Goodwill Industries. You need to contact to arrange for pickup. Please let the office know date for pickup.
